Keep clean or risk being fined, Ampang Jaya eateries told

WHILE there have been no restaurant closures in Ampang Jaya to date, its local authority is warning eatery owners to step up their cleanliness to avoid being shut down.

Ampang Jaya Municipal Council (MPAJ) president Abdul Hamid Hussain said while sanitation at the eateries was under control, the council could not inspect every one of them.

"We have more than 1,000 eateries in Ampang and we can only check each premises once

or twice a year.

"We rely on public complaints and feedback so we can prioritise those specific areas," he said, adding that the owners should adhere to food safety guidelines to avoid compounds and forced closures.

As of May 31, out of 1,330 eateries in the municipality, the council inspected 361 premises, including restaurants, food courts and food stalls.

It issued 39 compounds for



various offences.
