Collaboration on keeping Teratai constituency clean

MPAJ and waste management company to conduct scheduled rubbish collection

EDUCATION, execution and enforcement. These are the three fundamentals of the 2018 Teratai Constituency Cleaning Campaign. Held at Dewan Komuniti Taman Muda, Kuala Lumpur, the event gathered residents and business owners from Taman Muda and Taman Putra.

Teratai assemblyman Bryan Lai Wai Chong said educating the public through brochures and flyers to emphasise the importance of cleanliness was the first step towards ensuring proper waste management.

Ampang Jaya Municipal Council (MPAJ) and KDEB Waste Management Sdn Bhd will execute a scheduled commercial waste collection every day while domestic waste collection will be carried out twice a day to reduce accumulation.

He said the exercise would be closely supervised by the councillors and members of the Zon 22 Residents Association.

CCTVs have been installed in the back alleys to catch culprits of illegal dumping.

MPAJ president Abdul Hamid Hussain said only 70 out of 285 business premises in Taman Muda abided by the procedure of providing rubbish bins at their units.

"A total of 155 compounds were issued by the MPAJ Enforcement Department for several misdemeanours, including operating without a business licence, obstructing sidewalks and discharging contaminated fluids on public property," said Abdul Hamid.

Business owners who fail to put rubbish bins on their premises by Nov 30 will be fined.

Lai said MPAJ would collect the bulk waste at business premises from Monday to Saturday to reduce illegal dumping of furniture in the back alleys.

A ceremony to hand out certificates was held to acknowledge the support and cooperation from representatives of MPAJ, Teratai residents, non-governmental organisations and KDEB staff.

The cleaning campaign will end next month.
