## 首次常月會議小風波 商領養選區意見分歧

大选后的首次常月会议，公正党与行动党市议员讨论各自所领养的选区时出现意见分歧，不过最终得以平息。

据了解，安邦再也市议会共有24个居民委员会（JKP），并由各自的市议员管理，不过基于选区划分等因素，各政党在居民委员会的分配也有所调整。

行动党党鞭莫哈末原本提议所有居委会需立即做好分配，并事先获得1个月的批准（endorse）来执行任务，惟公正党党鞭纳兰则认为需进行商讨后才能做出分配，因此提议将此事暂时展延，两党党鞭也坚持各自意见。

最终，行动党所管理的第19至24区属莲花苑州选区，也是行动党胜选的选区，因此不会和其他政党有所冲突，所以行动党的6个区域已获批准执行任务，其余18个区则待各政党党鞭召

THE first full board meeting for the Ampang Jaya Municipal Council (MPAJ) hit a snag when a disagreement broke out among the councillors regarding the division of the zones among the political parties.

This, and the selection of councillors who will sit in different MPAJ committees was on the agenda for the meeting following the swearing-in of councillors for the new term.

The division of zones among the councillors will only be endorsed at the next full board meeting in August, said council president Abdul Hamid Abdul Hussain.

PKR party whip D. Nallan said further discussion was needed with other party whips before the decision was endorsed.

"There is still some disagreement over the allocation of zones to the different parties, so it is best that we discuss it first," he said.

There was, however, no dispute regarding the zones allocated to DAP under the Teratai state seat.

DAP party whip Mohamad Samot @ Samat said any further delay would disrupt plans to help the community.

"I recommended for several names to be switched within the zones allocated to us, and it was approved.

"We cannot afford to have any delays and now, we can continue with our programmes," he said.

Abdul Hamid instructed the party whips to discuss the matter before the environmental and community health committee meeting takes place on Aug 10.

Earlier at the swearing-in ceremony, 23 councillors including council president Abdul Hamid Abdul Hussain took their oath of office.

There are nine councillors from PKR, two from Parti Pribumi Bersatu Malaysia (Bersatu) and six each from DAP and Amanah.

Out of the new line-up, 25% are women, failing to meet the Government's aspiration for 30% female representation at the policy-making level.

The six women councillors are Salmah Ismail, Haslina Abin, Suzana Shaharudin and Nor Hayati Haron from PKR, as well as Tan Swee Boon (DAP) and Nor Aliza Abdul Latif

Salmah and Tan previously served as councillors while the others are all new to the job.

In total, MPAJ has 16 new faces in its line-up of councillors for the new term, ending Dec 31, 2020.

Seven councillors were reappointed.

There is one vacant seat which has yet to be filled by the Selangor government.

The one non-governmental organisation (NGO) councillor was Lee Wee Ngap.

The new councillors for this term are Nallan (PKR), Ho Kam Fook (PKR) while Ten

Kiat Loong, Chua Yew Choong and R. Moganraj are from DAP.

The councillors from Amanah are Mohd Aris Ismail, Shamsul Ma'arif Ismail, Mohd Anuar Mohd Yusof, K. Thanabal and Abdul Aziz Abd Jalal while Hasli Sazali and Zulkifli Ibrahim are from Bersatu.

Out of the group, Nallan and Chua have previously served as councillors.

Ten, 28, who is the youngest councillor, has big plans and wants to help MPAJ improve in its dealings with the people.

"One of the issues I will be focusing on is

boosting the use of social media and ICT when interacting with the council.

"The MPAJ website, for example, should be more mobile-friendly as not many people use desktop to access it.

"It will also be easier for people to lodge complaints or find out information," said Ten, who has a Masters in Science and Urban Planning from the National Taiwan University.

Nallan, who served from 2009 until 2012, said he was keen to look into issues pertaining to illegal money lending and gambling dens.
