# MPAJ sentiasa pantau kebanjiran warga asing

**• Ambil tindakan pendatang langgar peraturan ubah suai kediaman, niaga tanpa lesen**

Majlis Perbandaran Ampang Jaya (MPAJ) tidak pernah mengabaikan permasalahan yang timbul berikutan keberadaan warga asing di sekitar Kampung Pandan Dalam, sekurang-kurangnya selama tujuh tahun lalu.

Selainnya, Pegawai Perhubungan Awam MPAJ, Norhayati Ahmad, berkata pihaknya sentiasa melaksanakan pemantauan termasuk mengambil tindakan ke atas warga asing yang melanggar peraturan khususnya pengubahsuaian rumah kediaman dan berniaga tanpa lesen.

“Sejak Januari hingga September tahun ini, MPAJ melakukan 56 pemeriksaan di sekitar Kampung Pandan Dalam dan mendapati warga asing melakukan pelbagai kesalahan mengubah suai rumah dengan menambah bilik, melebihi jumlah ditetapkan.

“Mereka juga menjalankan perniagaan di rumah berkenaan, yang

nyata melanggar syarat premis berkenaan untuk kediaman dan bukannya perniagaan. Walaupun sudah diberi amaran dan saman, penduduk tetap berdegil dan masih menjalankan perniagaan mereka.

Norhayati berkata, siasatan MPAJ mendapati kebanyakan rumah lot ini dimiliki penduduk tempatan dan disewa kepada warga asing.

“Pemeriksaan kami mendapat kebanyakan pemilik dan penyewa rumah membuat pengubahsuaian tanpa kebenaran. Walaupun saman dikenakan, mereka masih tidak mengendalikannya.

Antara saran yang dikeluarkan membabitkan ubah suai kediaman tanpa kebenaran (26 kes), perniagaan tanpa lesen kompaun dan sita (17 kes), salah guna bangunan bagi perniagaan (tujuh kes), meletak bahan binaan di jalan (empat) dan halangan jalan, dua kes.

Mengenai kehadiran warga asing di kawasan itu, beliau berkata, MPAJ sentiasa mengadakan perbincangan dan operasi bersama dengan bantuan Jabatan Imigresen serta Jabatan Pendataan Negara (JPN) dan semasa ke semasa.

**Sewa rumah**  
“Mereka akan menghentikan operasi masing-masing ketika pengluasaan MPAJ datang dan akan membukanya semula selepas beredar. Kebanyakannya dilakukan di perumahan di kawasan lot individu,” katanya ketika dihubungi BH.

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## Penduduk gesa MPAJ segera selenggara pokok, longkang

KUALA LUMPUR 12 Dis. - Penduduk di jalan Indah 10, Taman Cheras Indah menggesa Majlis Perbandaran Ampang Jaya (MPAJ) segera melaksanakan kerja-kerja penyelenggaraan pokok dan longkang di kawasan perumahan itu.

Timbalan Ketua Biro Perkhidmatan dan Aduan Awam Parti Gerakan, Ben Liew Pok Boon berkata, kegagalan pihak berkuasa tempatan (PBT) itu berbuat depannya menyebabkan penduduk hidup dalam keadaan tidak selesa.

Menurutnya, ranting dan daun pokok yang tidak dicantas telah memasuki longkang sehingga menyebabkan tersumbat.

Beliau berkata, ekoran daripada masalah tersebut air akan bertakuk dan melimpah ke luar dari kawasan longkang itu apabila hujan lebat sekali gus mengeluarkan bau busuk.

"Difahamkan, lebih 20 buah keluarga yang berada di kawasan itu terpaksa menahan bau busuk setiap kali mereka keluar dan berbesar mata mencari dengan keberatan hatian berbisa seperti ular.

"Pihak kami akan menghantar surat kepada MPAJ agar tindakan segera dapat dilaksanakan demi kesejahteraan penduduk," katanya kepada pemberita selepas membuat tinjauan di kawasan terlibat.

Tambah Ben Liew, beliau agak

terkilan dengan tindakan kerajaan negeri sedangkan bajet yang diumumkan untuk infrastruktur sangat tinggi namun, tidak nampak hasilnya.

Sementara itu, seorang penduduk, Alex Lee Chee Seng, 35, berkata, kehadirannya meraka sentiasa merasai rasa takut dengan bahaya nyamuk adegs dan kehadiran haiwan berbisa.

"Aduan telah banyak kali dikehukumkan penduduk tetapi sehingga ke hari ini tiada sebarang tindakan diambil.

"Diharapkan, MPAJ dapat mendengar rintihan kami dan segera menyelesaikan masalah ini," katanya.

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ERRANT developers are the main culprits contributing to flash floods in Selangor, based on a recent survey carried out by the state government, indicating 15 new flood hotspots at development sites across the state.

Almost 60% of current development areas in the state were not adhering to requirements by local authorities to have silt traps and bunds to hold water from the sites to cope with heavy rain.

Selangor's infrastructure, Public Amenities and Agro-based Industry chairman Zaidy Abdul Talib said the findings were made during a special operation called Ops Lumpur which he headed to check on developers not doing their part to reduce flooding.

Zaidy said out of 41 locations visited, only 17 adhered to the rulings set by local councils.

"Another 24 locations or 59% were found to have flouted the law imposed by local councils. Complaints worth RM505,000 were already issued to these developers," he added.

Zaidy said three construction

sites were issued stop-work orders while 14 were issued Notice to Correct (NTC).

He said the state government wants to ensure developers adhere to proper maintenance practice at construction sites to prevent flooding.

Zaidy said the inspection team which involved the Drainage and Irrigation Department set a target of 55 locations to visit this year.

Zaidy said most developers ignored the directions relating with regards to flood mitigation because of the additional costs

involved.

"Developers would rather pay the summonses they get from the councils instead of spending money to ensure floods do not occur around their construction sites," he added.

Zaidy said the inspection team will continue to do its job.

Precautionary works construction sites need to undertake were to have silt traps and bunds to hold runoff water from the sites.

Zaidy said all developers must adhere strictly to the ruling to prevent flooding as there was a forecast of high rainfall for Selangor this month.

He said the estimated total rainfall for Selangor this year was 2,600mm which meant a balance of 572mm left for the next few weeks.

Zaidy added that floods usually occur when there was 60mm rainfall based on the projected rainfall for the month and could be heavy rain in the next few weeks.

To help monitor the situation, he said a special Flood Prevention Task Force was set up.

"In the past we had situations where different agencies had difficulties communicating with

to the ministry that the ban be implemented in other areas of the city," he said during a press conference after the meeting.

Following a Bank Negara report released in June, Second Finance Minister Datuk Seri Johari Abdul Ghani said the Government had put a blanket ban on four types of developments, namely shopping complexes, offices, service apartments and luxury high-rise apartments priced over RM1mil effective Nov 1 this year.

In the first MPs' meeting of the year, with the mayor, several of the Kuala Lumpur MPs brought up other issues such as the DBKL budget and the draft Kuala Lumpur City Plan 2020.

On the checklist for Kuala Lumpur City Plan 2020, Lim said they were informed that DBKL would be working on a 2040 or 2050 version of the plan.

"DBKL will use the KL Structure Plan 2020 as well as the Kuala Lumpur City Plan 2020 as a base for fine-tune and improve the new plan."

"However, there is still no timeline on when the new plan will be gazetted," said Lim.

Meanwhile, Cheras MP Tan Kok Wai opposed DBKL for not presenting a detailed report for the 2018 DBKL budget for each constituency located within the Federal Territory of Kuala

Lumpur.

"In previous years, the MPs would be called for a meeting once the draft budget was ready, but this year we were only informed once the budget was announced."

"We do not know what is the breakdown of expenditure for each constituency when the projects or programmes that would be undertaken," he said, adding they were only given a booklet with the summary of the budget.

Other MPs who attended the meeting were Wangsa Maju MP Dr. Dato' Kee Kwong and Bandar Tun Razak MP Tan Khalid Ibrahim.

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each other for various reasons. The task force will meet as and when the need arises," he added.

The task force had identified 180 flash flood locations in Selangor which had 264 flooding incidents in the past.

Sabak Bernam has 14 new flood hotspot areas due to increased rainfall.

Zaidy said the state has 15 flood mitigation projects in place that will end by 2018. There will be an additional 14 new projects to commence in January next year.

He added that all relevant agencies and local councils have been forewarned to prepare for emergency flood situations.

All are currently on standby while evacuation centres are also being prepared to receive occupants at short notice.

"We want to advise those residing in flood-prone areas to be prepared. We will assist them," Zaidy added.

Meanwhile, councils and district offices are seriously looking into flood preparations with their respective Quick Response Teams (Pantas) on standby with the

necessary equipment. Klang Municipal Council corporate communications director Norfiza Mahfiz said there were six locations deemed high risk at Pengkalan Tok Muda, Batu 4 Jalan Kapar, Benteng Sementa, Port Klang, Jalan Pandamaran-Banting and Taman Selat Damai.

Both Sabak Bernam District Council and the Sabak Bernam District Office are on standby for possible flooding.

An officer from the Sabak Bernam District Disaster committee said they alerted the Fire and Rescue Department, Malaysia Civil Defence Department

(JPAM) and the police to be on standby to provide assistance for possible flood relief operations.

"We have been monitoring the situation and so far there has been no cause for concern yet.

"As soon as we see any activity, we will open up the operation centre," said the officer.
