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Stadium Mini MPAJ dijangka siap hujung bulan ini

AMPANG 26 Mac - Stadium Mini Majlis Perbandaran Ampang Jaya (MPAJ) yang dibina dengan kos sebanyak RM19 juta dijangka siap sepenuhnya pada penghujung bulan ini dan mula beroperasi pada Jun.

Setiasaha MPAJ, Hasrolnizam Shaari berkata, stadium tersebut mendapat pengiktirafan badan induk bola sepak Persekutuan Persekutuan Bola Sepak Antarabangsa (FIFA) setelah wakil FIFA membuat pemeriksaan di stadium yang menggunakan padang rumput sintetik itu pada Februari lalu.

"Stadium ini mampu memuatkan lebih 1,000 penonton dengan kapasiti maksimum mencecah 5,000 penonton dalam satu-satu masa.

"Ia juga dilengkapi permukaan balapan berteknologi terkini dan kemudahan asas seperti bilik persalinan, bilik rawatan, bilik media dan ruang khas untuk orang kenamaan," katanya selepas melawat projek pembinaan Stadium Mini MPAJ bersama pegawai-pegawai MPAJ di Pandan Perdana disini, baru-baru ini.

Selain itu kata Hasrolnizam, stadium itu juga menempatkan kira-kira 100 ruang letak kenderaan di kawasan stadium dan ruang tambahan di luar stadium.

"Stadium yang terletak di laluan sistem transit aliran ringan (LRT) ini diharap dapat memberi manfaat dan meningkatkan acara sukan di negara ini," ujarnya.

Pemasangan CCTV mampu kurangkan kadar jenayah

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TAMAN MUDA - Pemasangan kamera litar tertutup (CCTV) di Pasar Pagi Taman Muda mampu mengurangkan kadar jenayah di kawasan berkenaan,

Pengerusi Persatuan Penjaja dan Peniaga Kecil Taman Muda Selangor, Chow Chee Keen berkata, 32 buah CCTV yang dipasang turut membantu siasatan polis.

"Penggunaan CCTV ini bukan sahaja menjadi langkah awal pencegahan jenayah, malah boleh membantu siasatan pihak berkuasa mengesan penje-

nayah," katanya.

Chee Keen berkata, seramai 400 peniaga dan penjaja bersepakat mengeluarkan kos untuk pemasangan CCTV ini.

"Banyak kes seluk saku dan toreh beg berlaku, sebelum pemasangan CCTV di kawasan ini. Kami mengeluarkan kos sebanyak RM30,000 untuk pemasangan CCTV, kita juga boleh melihat rakaman CCTV melalui telefon pintar," katanya.

Dalam perkembangan berasingan, Chee Keen turut membangkitkan masalah

kekurangan parkir di kawasan itu.

"Bilangan pelanggan berkurangan sejak tiga bulan lalu, ia berkemungkinan kerana masalah parkir di sini, saya berharap masalah ini dapat diatasi segera," katanya.

Sementara itu, Timbalan Ketua Biro Perkhidmatan dan Aduan Awam Gerakan, Ben Liew Pok Boon berkata, pihaknya turut dimaklumkan sebuah pembesar suara telah dipasang bagi memudahkan sebarang pengumuman jika ada kereta menghalang.

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MPKj holds brainstorming workshop to control dengue in Hulu Langat

IN RECOGNISING the need for more effective measures to control dengue in the Hulu Langat district, Kajang Municipal Council (MPKj) held a special brainstorming workshop for its officers.

The Brainstorming Workshop to Empower the Prevention and Control of Dengue Outbreaks in Hulu Langat District was held at the Dewan Sri Cempaka community hall in Saujana Impian, Kajang.

It was attended by MPKj officers as well as representatives from the Hulu Langat District Health Office and Ampang Jaya Municipal Council (MPAJ).

MPKj deputy president Najmuddin Jemain attended the

workshop launch to also announce the council's new anti-dengue tagline: "Gerak – Gempur Aedes Kajang".

Najmuddin said while the number of dengue cases had dropped, Kajang was among the more densely populated area in Selangor, presenting a bigger challenge when it came to the control of dengue outbreaks.

"For the benefit of the community, everyone needs to ensure that cleanliness in and around their homes is continuously maintained," he said.

"There needs to be greater awareness and cooperation from residents. They cannot just leave it to the council to act because the ones facing the risk of infection are the residents."

He said Aedes larvae could mature in bodies of water, small enough to fit a teaspoon, and that it was important for residents to regularly clear their living spaces of stagnant water and rubbish.

Najmuddin said MPKj planned to focus its efforts on hotspots in the district, with activities to raise awareness among residents, *gotong-royong* and increased enforcement.

"We hope this trend will continue towards the end of the year, but we would like to minimise those numbers if we can," he added.

The Hulu Langat district recorded around 1,100 dengue cases and two deaths in the first quarter of this year; a stark improvement from the 2,547 dengue cases and seven deaths in the first quarter of last year.
